COUNTRY FAIR RAFFLE TICKET SALES

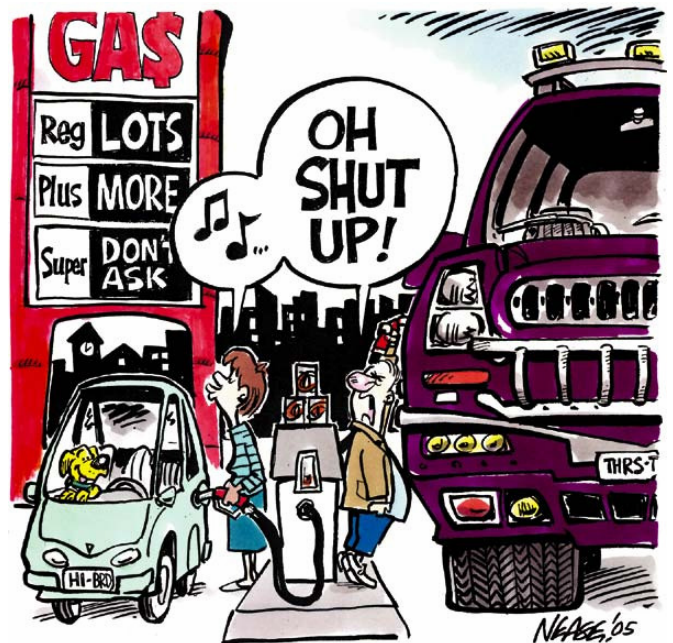
Fellow Lions:
