Dear Fellow Lions,

As I mentioned to you at the first business meeting last week 8/30, that I was on a committee for our District, 20 E-1, looking at getting a block of seats and group discount to see "The Lion King" performing next spring. This is chaired by our Vice-Governor Joanne Rodgers with the other committee members being from Hilton, Greece-Ridge, Medina, and Irondequoit clubs and E2 is also included.

We met last night at the Auditorium Theater and have blocked 500 seats for 3 dates. Price for the seats is \$58.00/ticket, which are prime seats. A lot of other groups are blocking seats so once the tickets go on sale to the public these "Prime" seats won't be available. I am attaching a sign up sheet which I will bring to the next few meeting and can also talk to you Friday night at the Country Fair appreciation

picnic if you want to purchase the tickets then.
The 3 dates that had a large number of prime seats that 20E-1 blocked are:

Sunday, April 9, 6:30 PM, 300 seats This will be designated as "Lions Night" for this performance with "Lion PR" present in the lobby.

Seats blocked are the first 10 rows from Stage Right & Left center 4-6 seats/row A-L, Center rows O-T all seats and Right & Left center T-S; plus Balcony Rows B-C, E Right, Center & Left Center rows all seats (no elevators to get to Balcony)

Wednesday, April 12, 7:00 PM 100-125 seats (right now very good seats blocked)

First 6 Right, Center & Left center seats from Stage, rows A-F & row O Center; plus Balcony first 4 center rows A-C, E.

Thursday, April 13 7:00 PM 100 seats blocked

First 9 rows Right & Left Center 4-6 seat/row, Center rows F & H, O-R, plus Balcony first 4 Center rows A-C, E

We can't get you specific seats, but the sooner you book the more likely you will have the better of the prime seats. I have the sheets showing the block of seats for each performance that have been reserved for us. The sale to the public starts 10/29, so group discounts are not available after that date. 20 E-1 will need to let the theater know how many seats we are keeping or blocking more if needed and **payment is required at the time you make your reservations.**

Please indicated which performance you want and how many tickets with payment at that time to me. It's on a first booking seating, Remember all of 20-E1 & some of E-2 will be booking too.
